Registration for the first session of Summer School day classes will be held at 10:00 a. m. June 11, with the term ending July 16. The second session of day classes will begin July 20, and end August 21. The student may enroll far as many as two courses in each of the Summer School day sessions.

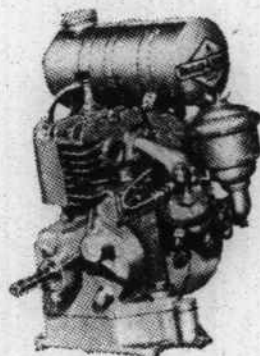
