

Night Classes To Continue At YHC

President Charles R. Clegg of Young Harris College has announced plans for continuing evening classes at the institution for the 1953 Fall Quarter. Veterans of World War II, the Korean War, or other persons meeting entrance requirements are eligible to register for these course offerings.

Registration for evening classes will take place in Pruitt-Barett Administration Building, September 23, at 6:30 p. m. Young Harris College authorities have advised that anyone desiring to enroll in these classes which meet five nights each week, should do so on or before the above date, since class membership is limited. Entrance requirements are graduation from an accredited high school or the equivalent.

President Clegg also announced plans to offer a series of specialized courses in secretarial work provided there is evidence of sufficient interest in these courses to merit setting them up. Classes would meet three nights each week. Anyone interested in this field of study is advised to contact Young Harris College authorities.

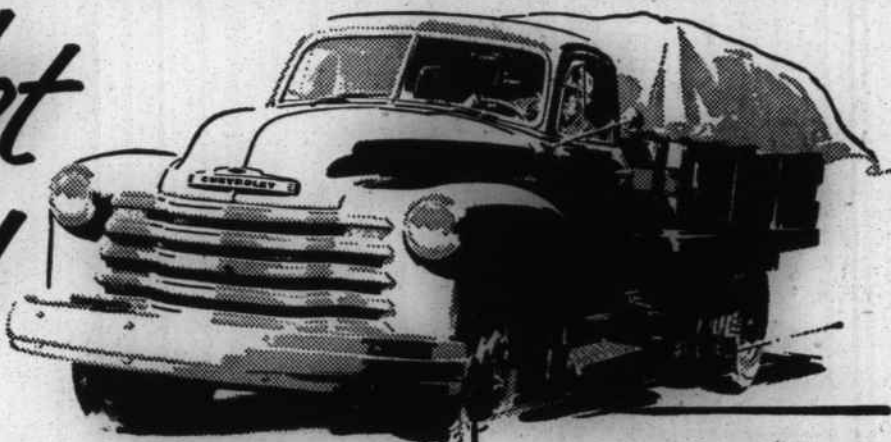
