Machine Will Be Largest Of Kind In World, TVA Says

This unique machine, which will be the largest of its kind in the world, will operate as a conventional turbine for the generation of power during peak load hours, and as a pump to return water to the lake behind the dam, during off-peak hours.

Production of power has been temporarily discontinued at Hiwassee, and the flow of water from the lake has been stopped, Mr. Leonard said. This will have the natural effect of lowering the Appalachia Lake, immediately downstream.

In addition, TVA engineers are taking advantage of the situation and will lower Appalachia Lake still farther to permit necessary maintenance work on the Appalachia powerhouse tunnel.

Machine Will Be Largest Of Kind In World, TVA Says

The area immediately below the Hiwassee Dam will be pumped out and a cofferdam will be constructed. Following completion of the cofferdam, the enclosed area will be pumped dry so that excavation work can begin, to be followed by concrete placing. It is estimated that production of power from Hiwassee's present single generator will be resumed about 10 days from now.
