

Hall, Brumby, Scott, Are High Men In Nominations

3,000 Vote In Demo Primary

A heavy Democrat primary—over 3,000 ballots cast—Saturday gave E. H. Brumby the nomination for State House of Representatives with 1,738 against 1,463 for Richard Mauney, and set up a run-off in the sheriff's nomination between J. L. Hall with 1,099 and Luke Carver with 1,062.

Other final totals in the sheriff nomination were Jake Brown, 876 and Glenn Hembree, 364. In the U. S. Senate nomination Scott took the county with 1,609 votes and Lennon drew 1,494 in the long term balloting. In the short term, the total was Scott, 1,242 and Lennon, 1303.

Over the state, Kerr Scott won a clear majority over the field of seven candidates. Complete returns gave Scott 310,815 to 286,441 for Lennon.

Other candidates in the senate race over the state and their totals were: Alvin Wingfield, 8,299; E. L. Sprinkle, 2,432; A. E. Turner, 2,347; O. R. Boyd, 1,647; and W. M. Bostick, 1,375.

In the county, the other senate candidates and their totals are: Wingfield, 20; Boyd, 15; Bostick, 7; Sprinkle, 25; and Turner, 15, for the long term.

For the short term, Wingfield, 38, and Sprinkle, 38. Another possible run-off in the county balloting could be between Neil Sneed, high man in the Clerk of Superior Court race with 1,372, and Jerry O. Hatchett, next man with 738. Other totals in the Clerk race are Arnold Derreberry, 640, and P. H. Leatherwood, 551.

Unofficial reports give H. M. Moore the nomination for State Senate by around 400 votes. In Cherokee County, T. J. Herbert drew 1,999 votes and Moore got 1,361. In Clay County Moore, 595, and Herbert 360.

Kate Padgett Hensley was re-elected in the Register of Deeds race with 2,497 votes over Edwin Winchester with 678.

In the first district County Commissioner contest, Sam W. Jones was re-elected with 640 votes over Clarence Hogan, 480 votes.

In the second District, W. H. Brandon won over three other candidates with 633 votes. Other candidates were Roy H. Hells, 551; Frank E. Dickey, 219; and James Clayton, 83.

It was unofficially reported that a run-off would not be called in that nomination.

In county balloting for the State Treasurer race, Gill drew 2,018 votes and James 582. For Commissioner of Insurance Gold drew 1,340 and Fletcher, 1,064.

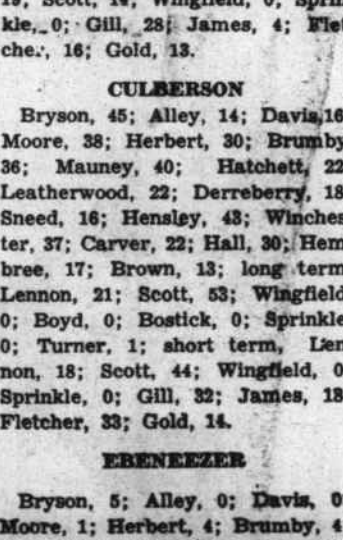

J. L. HALL High man in Sheriff race. Run-off probable.



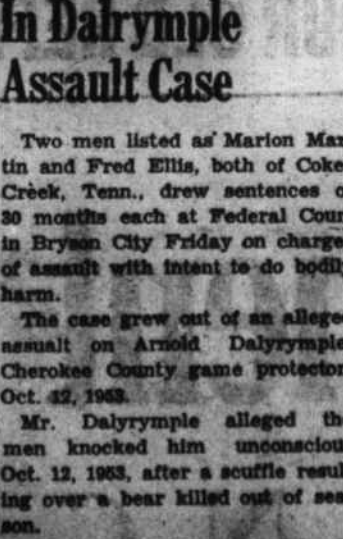

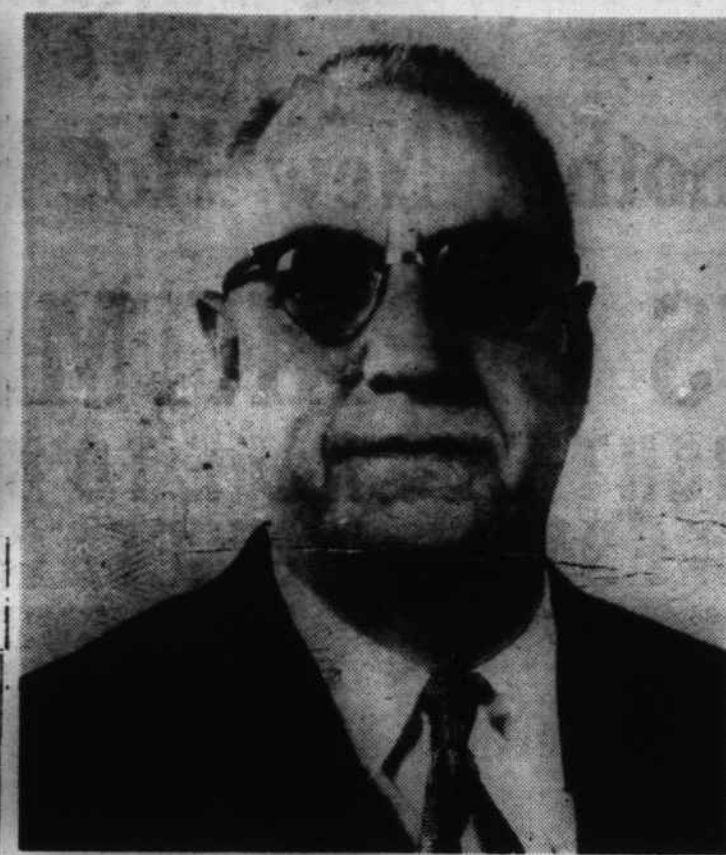
