ASC Official Wants "Spread" Reduced
In commenting recently on the ever-growing spread between prices farmers receive for their farm products and prices consumers

pay for these same products, in their local stores, Clyde R. Greene chairman of the ASC state committee, said that the major reason behind this was that farmers in the market place are entirely at the mercy of the buyers. On products not supported by CCC they have no control whatsoever over the prices their products bring, he said. On supported commodities their control is limited to the level of support.

Greene said that farmers now receive only 39 cents out of every dollar spent for food in the retail store. This is the lowest share the farmer has received in the last 15 years. This compares with a 53 cents share in 1945 and 42 cents last year.

Greene said that he hopes that this spread can be reduced, not by reducing the price the retailer receives, but by increasing the price the farmer receives. "That's just what ASC has been trying to do for a number of years. That's just what our Agricultural Conservation Program and all of our Price Support Programs are doing now to the full extent made possible under present legislation", he said.

The official said the farmer can do a good deal toward increasing his income by making full use of the Agricultural Conservation Program and by taking advantage of all available price support provisions.

Father's Death Most Frequent Reason For ADC

RALEIGH Jan. 25—Death of the father is more frequently the reason for a family in North Carolina to apply for aid to dependent children than in the nation as a whole.

This fact and others revealing the careful and conservative program of North Carolina are shown in a comparison of the characteristic of North Carolina families receiving aid to dependent children (ADC) with the most recent comprehensive reports of ADC families in the nation as a whole, according to Dr. Ellen Winston, commissioner of the State Board of Public Welfare which administers this public assistance program.

In 53 percent of the ADC cases among white families the father has died or is incapacitated and for this reason the family has applied for help under the aid to dependent children program. This cause occurs only 47 percent of the cases in the nation as a whole.

In the ADC cases in North Carolina the father is less likely than families in the nation as a whole to have left his family through divorce, separation, desertion, or not being married to the mother. The national percentage for these reasons is 44 percent, as compared with only 35 percent in North Carolina.

However, in the nation as a whole only 4 percent of white fathers of children receiving ADC are in correctional institutions while for North Carolina the percent is nearly 10 percent, practically 2 1/2 times the national average. This again points to the need for intensive programs in connection with the rehabilitation of imprisoned fathers of young children.

So far as non-white families are concerned, death or incapacity of the father is the reason the family applies for ADC in 33 percent of the cases in North Carolina as compared with the national average of 24 percent.

Among non-white families receiving ADC, North Carolina has a better record than the national average with regard to the separation of the father through divorce,

desertion, or not being married to the mother. These cases account for 55 percent of the total ADC load in North Carolina, as compared with 70 percent for the country as a whole.

While only 3.4 percent of all non-white fathers in the United States

are unable to support their children because the fathers are in prison, the North Carolina percent is 10.5 or three times the national average.

Another area in which the North Carolina figures are sharply at variance with national figures is in

the average grant paid to families receiving ADC. At the time of the survey, the average grant in North Carolina was \$58 per month for the mother or caretaker and an average of three children per family. This compares with a national grant of \$83 per month.
