Gov. To Speak At Federation Meet

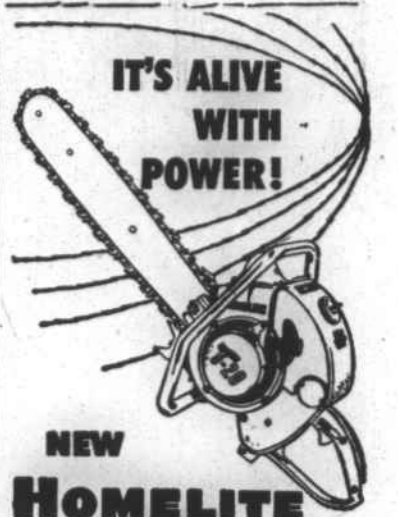
