In view of the fact that citizens of North Carolina are called upon to go to the polls Saturday, Septem ber 8, to vote upon an amendment to the state constitution called the P earsall Plan, in regard to the operation of our public schools, wet the undersigned ministers of Mur. phy wish-without attempting to speak for our local churches-to share with the voting constituency of this area our common viewpoint.

(1) We believe the Pearsall plan is contrary in its teachings to New Testament, and Christian practice. The New Testament Church favors, we believe, an in_ teregated pattern for society. This it assuredly does for the church, the redeemed body of Christ: "There is neither Jew nor Greek, bond nor free.


