North Carolina is now selling approximately one-half of its annual broiler output outside the state.

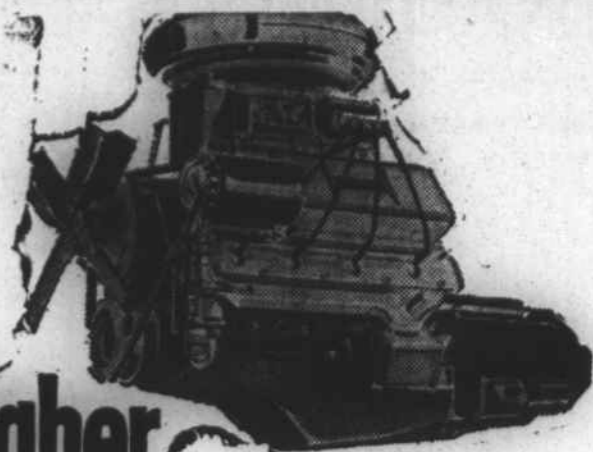
