Senator Scott never failed in his devotion to North Carolina and her people. An humble and modest man, Senator Scott exemplified those qualities which have characterized our greatest statesmen and leaders.

He has plowed to the end of the

row; his furrow is deep; time will not erode his indelible imprint upon our great State for which he so unceasingly labored and gave his full measure.

As one who has served with him in the United States Senate, I can testify with pride that Senator Scott served North Carolina and the Nation with honor and distinction, carrying on the high tradition of his predecessors.

I shall miss him greatly. The Senate will certainly miss him, and North Carolina will ever remember William Kerr Scott of Haw River.

Saving Bonds Sales Total \$4,331.10

Saving Bonds sales in Cherokee County in March totaled \$4,331.10. This was announced this week by W. D. Whitaker of Andrews, county Savings Bonds chairman.

March sales are 26.6 per cent of this county's 1958 sales goal, Mr. Whitaker said.

The first quarter of this year ended with the combined sales of Series E and H Bonds in North Carolina showing a 4 per cent increase over the corresponding period of 1957. While Series E Bonds were 2 per cent behind, Series H Bonds increased in excess of 78 per cent.

Total sales for the first quarter exceeded \$13,000,000, which is approximately 27 per cent of the State's annual goal.

Nation-wide sales during the month of March and the first quarter of this year exceeded sales for the same period of last year. Redemptions were down 8 per cent. Sales exceeded redemptions by \$42,000,000.

N. C. Offers Many Attractions To May Travelers

In May, summertime surf and sun begins at North Carolina's seashore resorts as the charm of the Appalachian springtime lingers across the Blue Ridge and Great Smoky Mountains of "Variety Vacationland".

Recreational and scenic attractions are open and the choice of accommodations is excellent. "Extra added attractions" enjoyed by May travelers are prime fishing from coast to mountains, and the blossoming of spring wildflowers in the mountains.

From Gulf Stream to the mountain trout streams, May is a top fishing month in North Carolina. On the coast, there are 20 ocean fishing piers, and boats for deep sea and inlet fishing can be chartered at 19 different harbors. Lake fishing is good from the Coastal Plains to the Great Smokies. Trout streams in the Great Smoky Mountains National Park re-open May 16; other mountain trout streams have been open since April 5.

In the North Carolina mountains, there is a continuous display of flowering trees and shrubs in May, beginning with dogwood, shadblow, mountain magnolia, silverbell and firecherry and continuing into June with native azaleas, mountain laurel and crimson (Catawba) rhododendron.

The Blue Ridge Parkway and other routes through the mountains are bordered with flowers, and panoramic views of the spring flower parade can be seen from hundreds of scenic overlooks.

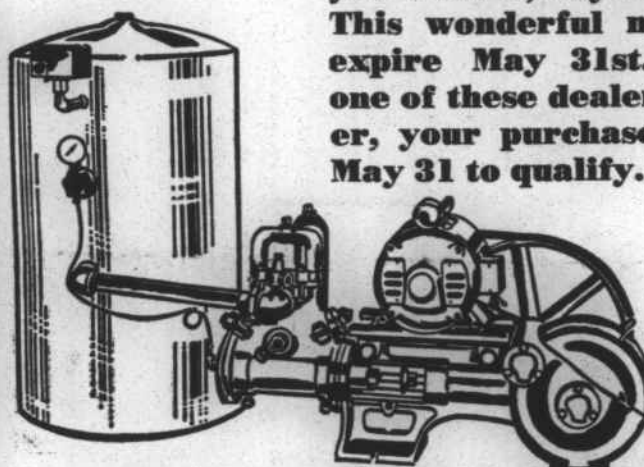
