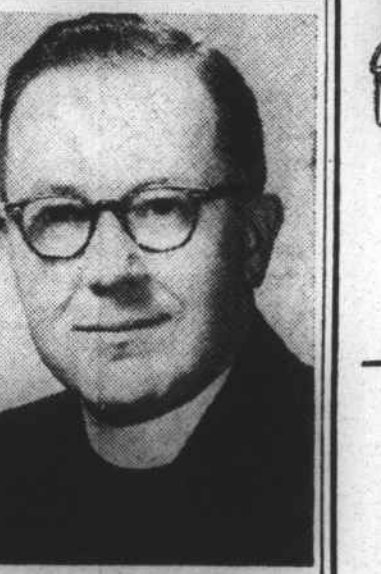

FARM QUESTIONS

QUESTION: What is one way to raise the average yield of oats on my farm?

ANSWER: By studying the different varieties of seed available for planting. No variety has everything. The individual grower should consider the characteristics of each, and then decide which would be the most suitable for his farm. County agents have the information needed on the various varieties.

QUESTION: Does it pay to feed silage on a year round basis?

ANSWER: Dairy specialists at N. C. State College say "yes." They offer as proof the 83-cow herd at the college dairy farm. For the year ending June 30, the cows averaged 11,596 pounds of milk and 472 pounds of butterfat. The cows had quality silage available at all times. However, the amount consumed depended on the lushness of the pasture.
