Soil Conservation NEWS

The Soils Scientist of the Soil Conservation Service has been in Cherokee County all of last week and most of this week making Land Capability Maps. These maps are the basis for Soil and Water Conservation Farm Plans. Among the farms which have been mapped are W. E. Moore and George Mauney of Peachtree, Frank Battle and Berkshire Mills of Andrews, Allan Chambers and R. W. Martin of Unaka, and Emery Anderson of Ranger, and Emery Shields of Culberson.

Frank Ghiringhelli of Basstown showed me some mighty fine young pine growing on his place last week. When timber was cut off of this land some years ago, shortleaf pine seed trees were left well spaced throughout the tract. As a result, natural seeding has reforested this land to a good stand of pine.

On another tract of land now owned but only recently acquired by Mr. Ghiringhelli, no seed trees were left when the timber was cut ten to fifteen years ago. On this tract there has been practically no natural re-seeding of pine. Instead, oaks, maple, sourwood and other cull and useless trees have taken this land. Before a profitable stand of pine can be gotten on this land by planting, it will be necessary to kill or cut all these cull trees. There will be no rash return if trees are killed, and very little if the trees are cut for pulp.

It always pays to cut timber selectively. Even when it is necessary to clear-out land due to unusual circumstances, it is essential that a good supply of seed trees be left to reforest the area naturally.

Any farmer who plans to cut any wood for pulp or for timber should procure the services of a professional forester to help him decide what to cut and what to leave. Federal, State and Commercial Foresters are available in this area at no cost or very low cost to the farmer.

The Wildlife and Resources Commission will again have Bicol or Lespedeza seedlings and Multiflora Rose seedling for free distribution this year. Any farmer interested in obtaining either of these useful plants can do so by contacting the County Game Warden, the county agent, or the technicians of the Soil Conservation Service.

The Supervisors of the Cherokee County Soil Conservation District have ordered one thousand copies of a pamphlet entitled "The Story of the Land". This comic book-type publication on Soil and Water Conservation is to be given to each pupil in the sixth and seventh grades of all the school in Cherokee County.
