and more North Carolina farmers will sell their tobacco on Georgia markets, where tying is not required. "The number of growers increasing in Georgia has been increasing for several years," Bennett said, "as the price differential between tied and untied tobacco continues to decrease."

Last year, tobacco growers in the five flue-cured states received \$540 million for their entire crop. This year, 1958, with a better growing season and a larger crop, prospects are that they will receive \$625 million or \$85 million more than last year.
