If the purchaser owns other land and wishes to combine the newly purchases land with the other land he must file a request with the county committee for the combination. The county committee, according to Godfrey, may not approve a combination unless the tracts are operated in the manner prescribed by the Secretary's regulations and instructions.

Before approving a combination, county committees are required to determine that a legal deed has been made and recorded in connec-

tion with the newly purchased land. Godfrey urged that lawyers or real estate dealers who are handling the sale or purchase of farmland or who are advising farmers in such transactions become familiar with the regulations before advising their clients or completing any such transactions.


