FORT BRAGG, N.C. (AHTNC)—Army Sergeant First Class Doyle L. Clay, 36, son of Mrs. Etta M. Clay, Route 3, Murphy, N.C., participated with other personnel from the 82d Airborne Division in Exercise Puerto Pine in Puerto Rico. The exercise ended March 31.

During the 18-day exercise, which included the largest peacetime airlift ever attempted, participating troops of the Strategic Army Corps (STRAC) were air transported from their home stations throughout the U.S. to a staging area in Puerto Rico and then returned.

Clay, regularly assigned as a supply sergeant in Company E of the division's 325th Infantry at Fort Bragg, N.C., entered the Army in 1943.

He attended Murphy High School. His wife, Mae, lives in Fayetteville, N.C.

CAMP LEJEUNE, N.C. (FHTNC)—Participating in a joint Navy-Marine Corps amphibious exercise, March 22-April 5, is Marine Pvt. James H. Baugh, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. L. Baugh of Murphy, N.C.

Marines deployed on the operation, called LANTPHIBEX 1-60, are members of the 2nd Marine Division from Camp Lejeune, N.C. It is the largest amphibious training maneuver scheduled for East Coast Navy-Marine Corps units this year.

During the exercise, the combat readiness of the striking arm of the Atlantic Fleet and the combat effectiveness of the Marine Corps' latest developments in equipment and landing techniques will be tested.

### High Waters Battled In Midwest

Rising waters and broken levees kept flood fighters moving Tuesday along the Mississippi and Missouri rivers.

Danger was concentrated along the Missouri in Missouri and in a 150-mile stretch of the Mississippi from the northern border of Missouri to the St. Louis area.

The Mississippi flowed into 5,000 acres of rich farm land after spilling over a levee in two places south of Clarksville, Mo., about 70 miles north of St. Louis.

A break in a dike near Augusta, Mo., let the Missouri pour over 2,000 acres of fertile bottom land.

A levee on the North River burst near the Mississippi River east of

Palmyra, Mo., and water rolled across 800 acres of land.

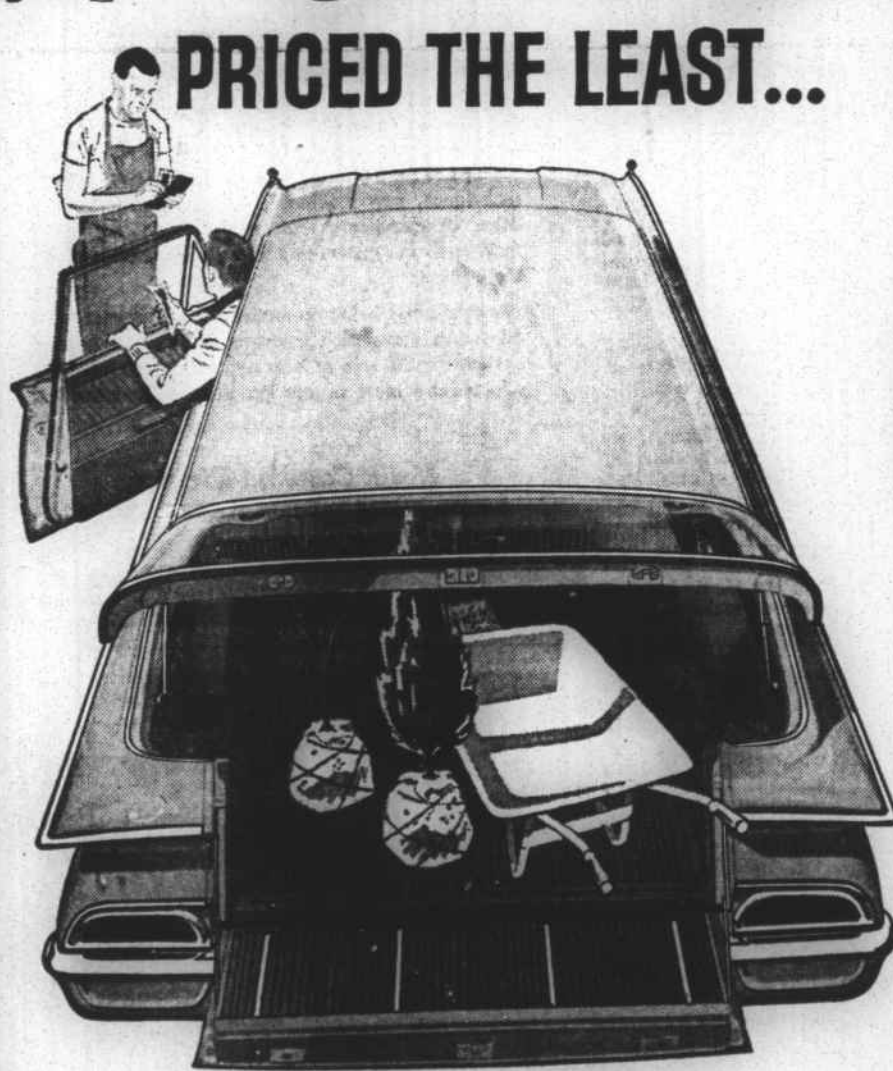
