Speech & Language

workshop hosted by LRDA's Indian Education

The Lumbree Indian Education Project of LRDA sponsored a Speech and Language Workshop on Oct. 12, 1976 for the instructors and center aides. The workshop was conducted by Ms. Wendy Grant, Speech Pathologist from the Robeson County Satellite Clinic of Southeastern Speech and Hearing Services.

In her presentation Ms. Grant discussed the types of speech and language disorders differences between speech and language, the developmental scales of the two year old through the five year old, and activities that may be used in developing language. Ms. Grant brought to the attention of the participants that in their observation of the children in the classroom they should be aware of the difference between speech and language. Speech is the way you pronounce your words and deliver your message. Language is the way you combine words to form sentences. It includes the vocabulary you use and your ability to understand other people who speak the same language. As the teacher at the center the children see them as their model and attempt to pattern their language after the teacher. Also very important in the speech and language development of the child is the parent.

The key to the foundation of language development is experience. The child must comprehend language before he is able to produce what is expected of him by others in his environment. This comprehension involves sensation, discrimination and perception. It is extremely important to remember that each of these stages develop with time and practice.

If you feel that your child has a speech or hearing problem, you may contact Ms. Wendy Grant at the Robeson County Speech and Hearing Satellite Clinic in Lumberton.

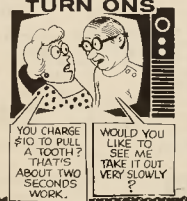
