Oxendine Teachers Attend Conference

The conference was held Feb. 17-18 at Bordeaux Motor Inn in Fayetteville. It was sponsored by the State Department of Public Instruction and the North Carolina Council for Social Studies. Highlighting the theme "Education for Global Citizenship."

The conference included teaching demonstrations, discussions, curriculum materials displays as well as several special two and one-half hour and three hour workshops focusing on topics of interest to all concerned with the teaching of social studies in grades K-12.

Special emphasis was given on both days to the teaching of reading in the social studies program at all levels. Other sessions covered a wide range of demonstrations of instructional techniques. Presentations were made by several consultants from the State Department of Public Instruction as well as by visiting consultants from colleges and universities in the United States.
