Locklear is from Saddletree. Rep Horace Locklear won the fouse seat by default when Adolph Dial from the Pembroke area withdrew from his stated idention to run in the last general decition for the house seat. The psychological mind set in the county at the present time is that the three members of the House of Representatives from the 21st bisrice should reflect the population as a whole: one white, one Black, and one Indian. Reportedly, Dial and his otherenis were wary about tampering with that mind set. They were concerned that a race between Locklear and Dial would disturb that status quo. Dial withdrew.

There was a feeling in some quarters that Locklear would nominate Dial for a seat on the UNC Board of Governors because of his withdrawal. Locklear did not. Locklear has nominated Mrs. Grace Epps, a remarkable lady who has recently retired from the position of class room supervisor with the Robeson County School Unit. her one questions her lifications. WASHINGTON. D.C.--About 200 Vative American Indians from tribes hroughout the United States are expected o participate in the National Conference on tigh Blood Pressure Control in the Native American Community, slated for April 10-22 here 0-22 here

Sponsored by the National High Blood Pressure Education Program and the Advisory Committee on Hyperension in Minority Populations of the National Institute of Health, the conference will be held at Twin Bridges Marriout Hotel, across the Potomac Rier.

"The basic intent of the conference," its planners state, "is to provide an opportunity for a wide cross-section of professional and 'on-professional indians to meet together to discuss issues affecting delivery and acceptance of high blood pressure control and related health care,"

pressure common and retared nearth care." The conference program is aimed at health professionals and para-professionals, low-income consumers of health services, and volunteer workers providing health services to Native Americans. It will include presentations and workshops on Native Americans in the health professions, the Indian Health Service, specific needs of Native American communities in the health professions, the Indian Health Service, specific needs of Native American communities in high shood pressure control, increasing public wareness of hypertension danaers

Among program speakers and panelists will be members of the San Juan Laguna Chippewa, Apache, Sioux, Lumbee Delaware, Lummi, Navajo, Pueblo Apache, Peorja/Wea, and Cherokev/Chectus teleware.


