**What is LSNC--**It is the central management program responsible for overseeing the delivery, through a confederation of multi-county field programs, of aggressive, tough-minded, high-quality legal representation to most of North Carolina's two million poor persons. LSNC's field programs retain essential autonomy over their day-to-day operations while the central office provides support, planning, funding, coordination and direction for statewide efforts.

**Duties of the Director of Administration--**It is a new position intended to serve three major purposes: (1) carry out broad administrative responsibilities in the operation of the statewide program, working under the supervision of the Executive Director; (2) learn how to administer a statewide or other multi-office Legal Services program; and (3) act as the EEO officer of LSNC. Thus the position is designed both to share in the substantial burden of managing this program and to receive on-the-job administrative training from an experienced project director. The job is not a "Deputy Director" position, however; the person will have equal status with the other members of the management staff, each of whom reports directly to the Executive Director.

**Qualifications for the Job--**(a) a law degree (although membership in the Bar is not a necessary requirement for the job, to the extent you some day may want to become a project director your chances are probably better if by then you have been admitted to the Bar); (b) demonstrated leadership ability; (c) 2 to 3 years full-time experience beyond law school as an attorney, paralegal, law clerk or other legal experience, preferably but not necessarily in poverty law work; (d) a serious intention to learn and practice in the field of management and administration as opposed to law; (e) well-organized; (f) ability to work well with other people; (g) ability to write analyses and summaries clearly, succinctly and in an organized way; and (h) a commitment to using the legal system to help change the conditions under which poor people live.

**Forty Indian Groups Petition For Federal Status**  
 The Bureau of Indian Affairs has received petitions from forty Indian groups seeking to be acknowledged by the Federal Government as Indian tribes.  
 A list of the 40 groups, from 21 states, is being published in the Federal Register as required by regulations made effective October 2, 1978. These regulations establish the procedures for establishing that an American Indian group exists as an American Indian Tribe.  
 A total of 496 Indian or Alaska Native groups are now acknowledged by the Federal Government to be tribes. These groups are located in 27 states and include 218 Alaskan Village groups.  
 Under the regulations only those groups whose members and their ancestors existed in tribal relations since aboriginal times and have retained some aspects of their tribal sovereignty can be acknowledged as tribes. Failure to be acknowledged under these regulations would not constitute a denial that the group is Indian. Acknowledgement of tribal existence is a prerequisite to the protection, services and benefits from the Federal Government available to Indian tribes.  
 Groups from seven states, not presently listing any federally recognized tribes, are among the petitioners. These states are Alabama, Connecticut, Delaware, Georgia, Maryland, Massachusetts, and South Carolina.  
 Other states represented by petitioners are: Alaska, California, Colorado, Florida, Kansas, Louisiana, Michigan, Montana, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, North Dakota, Oregon and Washington.  
 Included as petitioners from North Carolina are the Hatteras Tuscarora Indians, Vernon Locklear, Route 3, Box 47A, Maxton, North Carolina 28364.
