

FHA To Offer Hurricane David Related Loans

Billy D. Batchelor, County Supervisor, Farmers Home Administration in Robeson County, announced today that his office has received authorization to make Emergency Loans to farmers who have suffered damages and losses caused by Hurricane David. The designation is for the period of September 4, 5 and 6, 1979. The loans are made to eligible farmers at five percent interest up to the amount of actual loss. Amounts needed in excess of the actual loss loan are available at higher interest rates. Farmers should apply for physical losses before June 11, 1980, and for the production losses before September 10, 1980. Farmers may apply for loans at the FmHA county office located at 400 East Second Street, Lumberton, North Carolina.
