Pembroke State University's men's tennis campaign continues in action on Saturday when the Braves host Elon at 10 a.m.

"We feel we have two outstanding players in our co-captains of Lee Dehart of Rockingham and Allan Terry of Fayetteville," state Pembroke State first-year Coach Bob McEvoy. "We are expecting to mature as the season goes on."

Coach McEvoy continued, "Our keys for success will be the ability to pull together, staying confident, and working hard to improve each match."

Playing a 17-match schedule of which 10 are at home, the Braves will meet several well-respected tennis teams in LeHigh, Salisbury State, Md., UNC-Wilmington, Atlantic Christian, and Campbell.

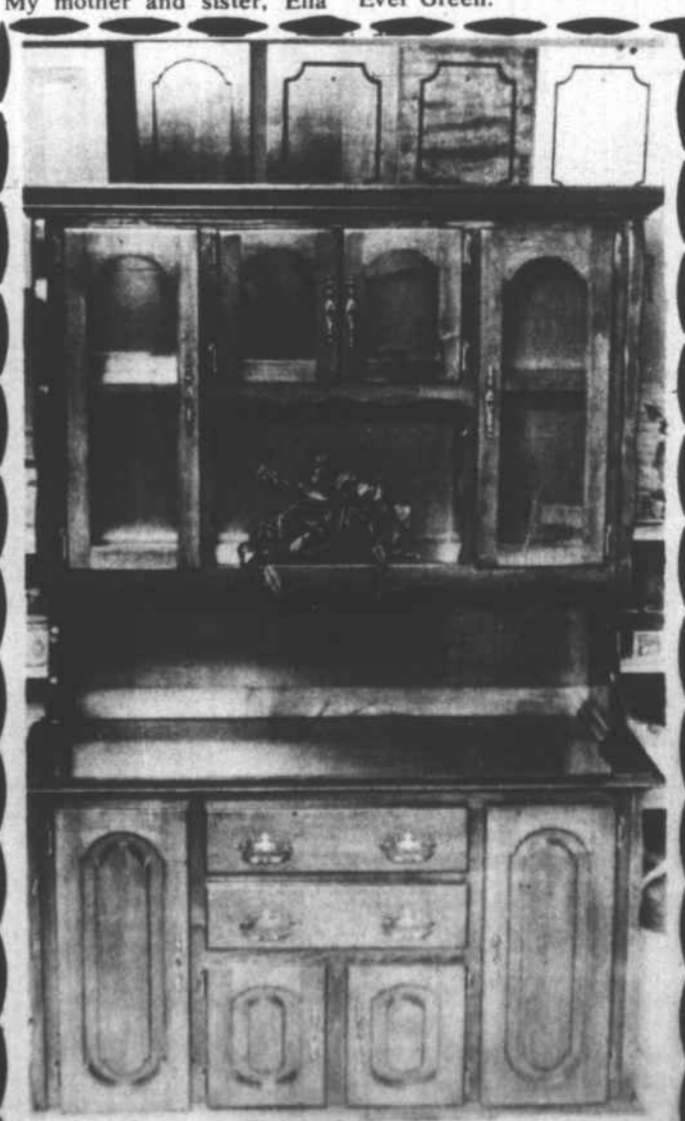
