The On-The-Job Training (OJT) is training in the private or public sector given to a participant who has been hired first by the employer and which provides knowledge or skills essential to the full and adequate performance of the job. The training duration may be from 6 months to 12 months depending on the complexity of the training, and the employer is reimbursed 50 percent of the participants wages (but not fringe benefits).

This is a great opportunity for local business/industries to train employees needed by the company at 50 percent of the cost.
