LONGHOUSE LEARNING CENTER STUDENTS GO TO THE DENTIST

LRDA's Lumbee Indian Education (LIE) Project operates three Lumbee Longhouse Learning Centers as a program component. During the month of April, the students from the three centers [located at Fairgrove, Pembroke and Magnolia] visited two Indian dentists as part of their pre-school dental screening. The two Indian dentists were Dr. Angela Chavis-Mickey of the Rowland Dental Center and Dr. Jeff Collins of the Pembroke Dental Service. The students received oral examinations, had their teeth cleaned and received instructions in the

proper way to brush and take care of their teeth.

The dentists also made recommendations concerning further needs of the students concerning dental care. For some students this was their first to a dentist's office.

The trips were also part of the Longhouse Learning Center's curriculum which emphasizes career awareness. The students were able to see examples of minorities with successful occupations in their chosen field. In addition to both dentists being Indians, Dr. Angela Chavis-Mickey is a female, proving that despite the fact the students are minorities, they can become whatever they wish to become.
