**ARABIAN HORSE**  
 The origin of the Arabian horse remains a zoological mystery. Experts can't agree on its origins. Some historians argue that its ancestry traces to the wild horses in northern Syria, southern Turkey or the southwestern area of Arabia. We do know that by 1600 B.C., people of the East had developed mastery over the hot blooded mastery that were the forerunners of the breed that has come to be known as Arabian.



Historic artifacts dating back to the 16th Century B.C. testify to the high honor paid to the Arabian horse. Its image appears on seals, rings, and various monuments. Egyptian hieroglyphics proclaimed its value and writings in the Old Testament are filled with references to the might and strength of the horse.
