## Road Death Toll Reaches 7

Hoke County died Monday night in a head-on crash, bringing to seven the number of people killed in North Carolina traffic accidents during the long Fourth of July weekend, according to the state Highway Patrol.

The victim was identified as George Maynor, 56, of Route 1, Raeford. Trooper A.J. Beason, who investigated the accident was also a witness.

Maynor was heading north on U.S. 401 about 514 miles north of Raeford when his car crossed the centerline and struck a tractortrailer rig head-on. The truck driver was not injured.

In other accidents, a Harnett County man died Sunday night in a motorcycle accident.

Six of the victims died on roads and highways in the Cape Fear

Leonard Elton Tripp, 11, of Dunn, died Sunday when he entered a curve at a high rate of speed and lost control of his motorcycle about 8:40 p.m., troopers said. The bike and rider crashed down an embankment on Rural Paved Road 1779, a mile south of Erwin.

Dierdra Long Thweatt, 39, of Route 3, Cameron, died when the car she was driving left a rural road 6 miles north of Southern Pines and struck a tree about 7:30 a.m. Sunday, the patrol said.


