Classes are designed for anyone 18 years or older. who wish to attend classes at RTC on a full-time or part-time basis, day or night. RTC's "open door" policy assures adults the opportunity to continue their education regardless of race, color, sex, age, religion, handicap, national origin, or other non-relevant factors. A high school diploma or its equivalent (GED) is required for admissions to the two-year Associate Degree programs. 

It has been rightly observed that our Lord Jesus Christ was both conservative and radical. He defended the laws of God and He revered the prophets of old. He built His message on the Old Testament-the Bible of His day.

At the same time, He broke with His contemporaries in their emphasis on human traditions. He did things that shocked the conservatives of His day--He ate with sinners. He treated women and children with concern and dignity. He disregarded nit-picking rules that made life a burden. He never relaxed His emphasis on God-given truth, but He recognized the transitory nature of human institutions and convention.
