Dr. Adolph Dial, chairman of PSU's American Indian Studies Department, challenged the auditorium full of Indian representatives. "This thing about education, Indian education, let it begin here. It is fitting that it begins here." he said. "We realize we've come a long way, but we have a long way to go."
Bruce Jones, executive director of the N.C. Commission of Indian Affairs which sponsored the symposium, stated: "I think this will be a landmark occasion. Out of these two days, we will send a strong message to North Carolina."
Dr. James B. Chavis, PSU vice chancellor for student affairs and one of the symposium's facilitators, used the symposium to reflectin PSU's centennial. "It would boggle the minds of our forefathers if they could come back and see PSU today. This is an outgrowth of their dreams. Don't underestimate the importance of this symposium. We are trying to expand upon what happened 100 years ago."



Downing spoke of the shrinking number of minority teachers. "Only 10 to 12 percent of our k-12 teachers are minorities, and by the year 2000 this will drop to 5 percent. At the same time the number of minority students in k-12 will be growing from 20 percent now to 38-40 percent by the year 2000. We've got to do something to attract minority teachers."

With this statement, Downing warned: "Our only hope to survive as a people is education." He told of the thousands of Indians who were forced to migrate to Oklahoma from the Southeast on the "Trail of Tears." "Those who forced them to go were 90 percent literate, while those who went had a 10 percent literacy rate."


