## PSU Sociology Department Chairman Becomes Editor of Criminal Justice Journal

Dr. Frank Schmallegger, who has been a member of the PSU faculty since 1975 and chairman of the Department of Sociology and Social Work since 1977, is now the editor of a professional journal about criminal justice whose material is being made available internationally.

Entitled "The Justice Professional," the journal is printed by Wyndham Hall Press of Bristol, Ind. Two thousand copies of this issue were published with the purchasing price being \$6.95 for an individual issue or \$12 annually for two issues. It is a semi-annual publication. Members of the advisory board are from four states: North Carolina, New York, Missouri and Minnesota.

"Our authors in this issue are experienced professionals in their own right and bring to the journal both personal and geographic diversity," says Schmallegger. "Among them are two police officers, seven professors, an attorney, and a graduate student. They hail from six different states: Alaska, Florida, Colorado, Illinois, Texas and Pennsylvania."

Schmallegger says such a journal is needed "because to be scholarly, one needs to publish and write. If not, we can't test our ideas out there in the real world. We can't stay current with all the innovations today."

This journal is the outgrowth of a more modest publication which began a year ago with the assistance of a PSU faculty development grant of \$700. "This new journal is no longer supported by grant money from PSU," said Schmallegger.

"In this issue," continued Schmallegger, "you will read about how law enforcement agencies perceive the significance of a college degree; you will learn that the search for truth in the classroom can often become a frustrating endeavor when social scientists become expert witnesses within an adversarial system of justice; and you will receive personal glimpses into the lives of public defenders faced with an often thankless task."

Articles that appear in the journal are selected by an elimination process with peers in the criminal justice field judging them and choosing the best. Short summaries of each article appearing are made available to the National Criminal Justice Reference Service (part of the Department of Justice in Washington, D.C.) at the service's request. Summaries are also sent to the National Institute of Corrections, based at Denver, Colo., and put on the Locked Data Base, a major computer service.

"Articles are also made available internationally on microfilm," said Schmallegger, obviously proud of his innovative journal.

## WPSU-TV Programs on Charlotte, Rockingham Stations

Beginning Jan. 1, programs produced by WPSU-TV will be made available on cable TV systems in Charlotte and Rockingham, says Dr. Oscar Patterson, PSU director of telecommunications.

The programs in the Charlotte area will be carried at 3 p.m. on the second Tuesday and second Thursday of each month over Channel 30.

The programs on Rockingham cablevision will be carried at 4 p.m. on the first and third Fridays of each month over Channel 24.

This means a huge market for the programs which are now carried over cablevision stations in Pembroke, Lumberton and Fayetteville.

## Anne Russell Co-Author History of Religions

Dr. Anne Russell, who is in her second year of teaching in the Communicative Arts Department at PSU, is the co-author of a pictorial book entitled: North Carolina PORTRAITS OF FAITH: A Pictorial History of Religions.

Dr. Russell, a native of Wilmington, has been a feature writer for the Winston-Salem Journal and UNC-Chapel Hill News Bureau, a reporter and entertainment editor for the Raleigh News and Observer, and press clerk of the N.C. Legislature. Her background includes two one-hour documentaries, a play, and a previous pictorial history of Wilmington. Her great-

grandfather was an Episcopal clergyman in Wilmington.

Co-author with her was Marjorie Megovern, a Wilmington journalist and arts administrator. The pictures were by Kevin Coughlin, a Wilmington-based photographer-designer. The 244-page book costs \$25. It was printed by The Donning Company of Norfolk, Va. Students in Teacher Training Increasing

Reports are that students are crowding into teacher-training programs in the UNC System, and this is certainly true at PSU.

According to Dr. Wright Killian, PSU assistant vice chancellor for academic affairs, there has been an 18.3 percent increase in students entering teacher-training at PSU over a year ago. In the fall of '85, 382 were involved in this program. This fall the number jumped to 452. The number of student teachers going out this spring will also be up sharply, says Dr. Don Little, PSU director of student teaching. Student teachers will increase from 42 last year to 64 this spring—a climb of 52.4 percent.

Students are being attracted into teaching by "higher salaries, job openings and promises of improved working conditions," says reports.

## Richard Vela Earns Doctorate

Richard Vela, director of advisement and retention at PSU who teaches in the Communicative Arts Department, has earned his Ph.D. in English at UNC-Chapel Hill. Vela, a native of Del Rio, Tex., received both his B.A. and M.A. in English at the University of Dallas. He joined the PSU faculty in 1971.

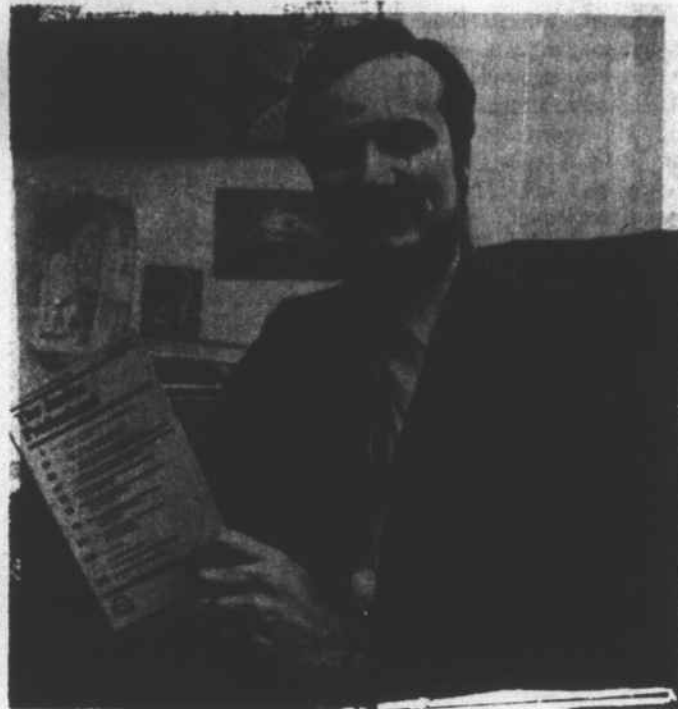
### LUMBEE BANK DECLARES YEAR END DIVIDEND
