**Survey Denotes Major Drug Problem In Pembroke Area**

Recently 61 homes in the Pembroke area were contacted regarding a community religious and temperance survey. The results of the survey were most interesting and indicate that there is a major drug problem in Pembroke. To many this may be nothing new, but the key is to change the "do nothing, hope-it-will-go-away" attitude of the public. To many of the citizens are afraid to get involved in fighting the drug problem. Many consider the responsibility to be that of the law enforcement agencies, or one's neighbor, or the guy down the street on the corner- anyone but me! But the problem is one that affects society, and when society is affected, each of us are.

In fact, out of the 61 surveys taken, 60 affirm that they think a drug problem exists in Pembroke. 1 had no opinion.

Another interesting fact from the survey indicates that alcohol is also a serious problem in Pembroke. 54 of the respondents to the survey said "yes" to the question, "Do you think we have a serious problem with alcoholism in this city?" 4 said "no" and 3 had "no opinion." Alcohol reduces the capabilities of one to think and be rational and people will often do things after a few drinks that they would never do in their normal state of mind. Could it be that alcohol might be part of the reason that drugs have made such an in-road into the community? Could it be that one habit can lead to another? Could it be that addiction to anything that ties one to itself could be cause for alarm?

21 of those surveyed responded "yes" to the question, "Do you smoke?" 40 said "no." Many of

those who responded "yes" indicated a desire to quit. As a result, it is expected that sometime in the next few months a free "stop smoking" plan will be offered to the residents of the Pembroke area so that those who want to "kick the habit" can take advantage of being free from tobacco.

Another question that was asked was "Are you interested in improving your knowledge of the Bible?" Of those answering "yes," 37 asked for Bible studies, either in person or by mail, to help them in their desire to understand their Bible better. Studies are available for anyone who would like to take them, either in person or by mail by writing to "The Bible Correspondence," P.O. Box 64397, Fayetteville, NC 28306. These are free lessons and there is no cost or obligation. Perhaps putting Christ and Christianity in our lives is the best deterrent to the problems noted above. If you think that is true, and if you are interested in knowing God's word in a more full and rewarding way, you are invited to attend the "Springs of Living Water" crusade which begins Saturday night at 7:30 p.m. The location is at the junction of Highways 710/711, just two miles West of Pembroke State University. This is an all denominations welcome event. It is not for any specific denomination or sect. It is for those who have a thirst and a desire for a greater knowledge of God's word as we face some of the final events of earth's history and as we prepare for the second coming of Jesus. There will be special meetings for the children ages 6-12, a nursery for those under 6, and a free gift to everyone who comes this Saturday evening. Everyone is invited attend!
