GERMAN UNIFICATION

Program Chairman Dorsey Lowry presented Prof. Robert W. Brown of the Pembroke State History Department. The German reunification process began the day of the 9th November 1989 with opening of the Brandenburg Gate, the opening of the wall. In the summer of 1991, Dr. Brown with Mrs. Brown walked through the same gate. Mrs. Brown speaks German. The East Germans had been under strict travel restrictions but were now free to travel. The changes were great in a short period of time, there was fleeing of the country as a prelude, the government collapsed in February 1990.

There was a period of chaos, not knowing the future until the incorporation began with the West. The collapse of Communism took place within as there was unexpected collapse in Russia. President Bush strongly supported the reunification. What made it possible was the discontent of the East German people. The

government was unwilling to suppress the demonstrations in Leipzig. The West Germans had to establish order on their borders and the Big Four had to agree to the reunification.

The Germans had to assess their problems as the wall had divided families, the problems of border crossings, choices had to be made for wide spread elections, foreign troops by 1994 to be out, the difficulty in attitudes from Communism to freedom, wall taking down is immense with its reinforced concrete. There are still bombed-out

building since 1945, no bridge across the Elbe River. No public telephones or gas stations, etc. A tremendous lack of infrastructure. The pollution left by these troops. Everywhere you look the rebuilding is on the way. A very optimistic view point exists for political democracy and market capitalism. Germany may not be as progressive anymore, but will be the strongest in Europe, thus serving as a grid between East and West.

LOW INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM L.R.D.A.

Applications will be taken from October 14, 1991 to November 27, 1991, for fuel assistance through the Lumbee Regional Development Association, Inc.

The Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program is not a first-come/first-serve program; any eligible Indian household that applied between October 14 through November 27th will receive a payment in February 1992.

The Department of Social Services will be taking applications on Non-Indian households.

All applicants should bring the following items when they apply:

(1) PROOF OF ALL INCOME FOR OCTOBER, SUCH AS—PAY STUBS, SOCIAL SECURITY LETTERS, ETC.; AND (2) INFORMATION ABOUT CASH, SAVINGS AND CHECKING ACCOUNTS; AND (3) INFORMATION ABOUT ASSETS SUCH AS PROPERTY, STOCKS, BONDS; AND (4) SOCIAL SECURITY CARDS FOR FAMILY MEMBERS.
