

Third Annual Pembroke State University Gospel Festival Slated for April 23

Pembroke State University officials are gearing up for the Third Annual PSU Gospel Festival, slated for April 23 at 7 p.m. in the Givens Performing Arts Center. Tickets for this event are \$5.

Headlining this year's gospel music program is the gospel sensation, Wendy Bagwell and the Sunliters of the Atlanta, Ga. area. Other groups slated to perform at the festival are Carla & Redemption of Lumberton and The Bereans of the Berea Baptist Church community and ministry, who will be doing the pre-show performance.

Wendy Bagwell and the Sunliters have enjoyed worldwide acclaim and have been honored with several awards including a Showmanship Award (given to them by the U.S. government for their gospel music performance on an extended tour of Europe); A Pioneer Award, and were awarded Album of the Year for their album "Here come the Rattlesnakes" in 1971. The group was inducted into the Hall of Fame of the Southern Gospel Music Association in 1982. In 1991, the group

was inducted into the Georgia Music Hall of Fame.

Leader of the group, Wendy Bagwell, is an ex-Marine and a successful businessman from Hiram, Ga. His tongue-in-cheek recollections of his youth and spirited anecdotes of the group's past tours will have audiences roaring with laughter. Other members of Wendy Bagwell and the Sunliters are: Jerri Morrison, Jan Buckner, Kevin Williams and Russell Wise.

Wendy Bagwell and the Sunliters were recently inducted into the Georgia Music Hall of Fame and received the GMA Grady Nutt Humor Award.

Carla & Redemption consists of five southern gospel singers and performers: Helen Oxendine of Lumberton, who sings alto; her daughter, Carla, who works as the afternoon drive time disc jockey at WSTS Radio in Fairmont; the Rev. Randy Sullivan of Red Springs, baritone; Earl Monds of Erwin, who sings bass and plays drums, and Mike Manuel of Pembroke, who plays bass guitar. Carla & Redemption are

very much a working gospel group which routinely tours, spreading the gospel in song to various parts of the country. Last year the group helped to spread their ministry for audiences at 160 performances.

The group will realize their first national release later this year when "Growing in Grace" hits the airwaves. Carla & Redemption have released "I've Found Him," and "Anointed." The Bereans consist of seven members, three men and four women. Members of the group are: Gina Revels, a Pembroke State University employee; Renford Scott, Miriam Oxendine and Felicia Locklear, employed with the Public Schools of Robeson County; the Rev. Bruce Sweet of the Berea Baptist Church; Pam Sweeney, employed with Scotland Memorial Hospital, and Kelvin Oxendine, employed with Abbott Laboratories. The group has been performing together for two years.

Farm Bureau Says Tobacco Farmer "Retraining" Will Not Work

W.B. Jenkins, President of the North Carolina Farm Bureau said today, "The stability of the American economy, and that of North Carolina in particular, is being put in jeopardy by dangerous suggestions emanating from the anti-tobacco climate which has settled over Washington."

He pointed to a recent action of the House Ways and Means Subcommittee as proof. He said, "The suggested measures from this subcommittee seek both to 'squeeze more tax dollars' from tobacco, and in turn 'squeeze growers of the golden leaf,' until they find other employment. I tell you, you cannot have it both ways!"

The subcommittee bill called for a large increase in tobacco taxes which was expected to generate an additional \$16 billion in revenue. Of this, \$100 million was earmarked to retrain tobacco farmers.

President Jenkins explained, "Tobacco producing communities in this state proudly contribute to the prosperity of the American economy. This bill would point farm families and local economies toward a future of non-productive public assistance and economic disaster."

The suggested retraining allowance would provide only \$700 for each farm family and provides

nothing for the thousands of other workers who depend on the tobacco industry.

"This idea has more holes than swiss cheese," he said. "What would farmers do with the specialized equipment such as harvesters, transplanters and built barns which cost thousands of dollars and would be useless after 'retraining'?"

He added, "Without the golden leaf, land values would plummet and money invested in tobacco allotments would be lost." The Farm Bureau President noted that thousands of migrant workers would be displaced as well.

"Families from Mexico and South America which each year come to harvest tobacco and share in American prosperity would shut-out at the gate. Beside making a mockery of the free-trade agreement which our country recently signed with Mexico—this bill would put farmers and migrant workers alike in the unemployment line."

President Jenkins concluded, "Washington's continuing attack on tobacco makes it clear that shaking gold from the tobacco leaf is a secondary aim to shaking life itself from tobacco. The House Ways and Means Subcommittee found a 'mean way' to express its real intent."
