85th Anniversary and Celebration of National 4-H Week Held

Robeson County 4-H members
and leaders are joining with others
across the state and nation to celebrate
National 4-H Week October 2-8 and
the 85th anniversary of 4-H work in
North Carolina. The theme is "4-H:
The Difference We Make," according
to Cathy M. Lowery, Extension agent,
4-H.

"What we do for our youth today,
we do for America tomorrow," the
agent said. "Through 4-H, young
people use their experiences and
expertise to acquire practical skills.
They learn good health habits, develop
respect for themselves, explore career
and leisure time opportunities, share
responsibility for preserving the
environment, learn how to use
technology, and develop leadership
and citizenship skills." The 4-H
program has a proud tradition,
according to Lowery. The first clubs
were organized in 1909.

Several special events will be held
during the week.

- Distribution of newspaper
supplement
- Dissemination of placements and
bumper stickers
- 4-H Church Sunday programs
- Encouragement of more youth to
join 4-H
- Urge more men, women, and

older teens to volunteer as 4-H
leaders

- Construction of bulletin boards
and promotional.

More than 5,200,000 youth are
enrolled in the 4-H program
nationwide. They are guided by some
650,000 volunteer leaders. It is through
a network of volunteer leaders, state
land-grant universities, state and local
governments, and the U.S. Department
of Agriculture, that 4-H has been able
to stimulate youth to develop life skills.
In Robeson County some 510 adult
volunteer leaders work with boys and
girls from 6-19 years of age through
the North Carolina Cooperative
Extension Service at North Carolina
State and North Carolina A&T State
Universities. Programs are conducted
in 3,150 counties nationwide. In
addition, some 82 countries around the
globe enroll approximately five million
youth in programs similar to 4-H.

In the Armed Forces

Navy Fireman Danny R. Chavis,
son of Raymond and Patricia Chavis
of Rowland, NC recently participated
in the 50th anniversary of the liberation
of the islands of Guam and Saipan in
the Western Pacific Ocean.

While off Saipan, Chavis took
part in several ceremonies honoring
those who died during the World War
II battle. A drill team from the ship's
crew marched in a parade to honor the
anniversary of the initial landings.

Accompanied by other ships in its
Amphibious Ready Group, Chavis and
the crew of USS San Bernardino also
traveled from the ship's homeport of
Sasebo, Japan, to Guam to take part in
another commemoration similar to
those on Saipan.

After its liberation in World War
II, Guam became the forward
headquarters of Fleet Admiral Chester
Nimitz until the end of the war.

Chavis is one of 257 crewmembers
stationed overseas aboard the forward
deployed USS San Bernardino.
Projecting a positive American image
while building international coalitions
and demonstrating U.S. power and
resolve from the sea, the crew of the
tank landing ship is uniquely capable
of conducting sustained operations in
remote areas of the world.

High School of Coral Springs, Fla.,
joined the Navy in November 1992.
