brought 18 fertilized eggs and put them into the incubator for a 21-day

At the end of the 21-days, eight (8) baby chicks were born to Mrs. Gwendolyn's students. They were very excited and at the same time very relieved. Each day students cared for the eggs by turning back and forth to prevent embryo from sticking to their shells. This was done by marking eggs on either side with an X' and an 'O'. Also by maintaining a temperature of 99.5.

degrees and checking the humidity in the incubator, eggs continued to develop properly.

Even though all eggs did not hatch, students enjoyed the embryology project and said they would love to try it next year
