J.T. Malcolm
(South Pembroke Precinct)
Mr. Malcolm is married to Vera L. Malcolm.
He retired from the Army as an E-6 July 31, 1976. He served 27 years, seven months and 18 days.
His foreign service included Korea, Vietnam, Metz, France, Gelnhausen, Germany, Athens, Greece, Ladberclor, and Tule Greenland.
Stateside service included Ft. Devens, Mass., Ft. Hood, Texas, Pine Camp, N.Y., Ft. Sill, Okla., Ft. Bragg, N.C., Ft. Knox, Ky., Ft. Jackson, S.C., Ft. Benning, Ga., Ft. Polk, La., and Anchorage, Alaska.
He received the Korean Service Medal with two Bronze Service Stars; U.N. Service Medal; Purple Heart; Three Overseas Bars; National Defense Service Medal; Combat Infantry Badge; and Sharp Shooter's Badge.

He retired as a Technical Sergeant with the United States Air Force after 30 years service to the USAF and the United States Army. He served 22 years active and 8 years with the Air Force Reserves.
Foreign service included Central Pacific, which is Hawaii. He was there during Japanese attack and also Tenth Army Okinawa.
He served stateside for approximately 17 years.
