**General Statement of Duties:** Performs a variety of responsible trades and tasks in maintaining, repairing and renovating buildings, maintaining and operating equipment and vehicles; and maintaining grounds for a public housing agency.

**Duties and Responsibilities:** An employee in this class performs skilled trade work in the maintenance, repair, and renovation of buildings, and maintenance and upkeep of the grounds. Mows grass, rakes leaves, edges sidewalks, trims trees, operates weed eaters; removes litter from grounds; cleans housing units; vacuums, strips, waxes, and cleans floors, cleans bathrooms, and appliances. Work involves performing a variety of trades. Work may be in response to resident requests, result from inspections or be part of the recycle process preparing housing units for new residents. Work may include carpentry, electrical, plumbing, painting, sheet rock replacements, or horticultural and grounds maintenance tasks. The employee works fairly independently, occasionally with the assistance of a temporary or part time worker. Employees are exposed to hazards and conditions associated with maintenance work including inside and outside environmental conditions, extremes in temperatures, and exposure to equipment, noise, gases, oils, and vibrations. Work is performed under the regular supervision of the Maintenance Supervisor and is reviewed through inspections in progress and upon completion.

**Minimum Qualifications:** Graduation from high school and three years of trades work experience in areas as assigned; and/or an equivalent combination of education and experience. Possession of a valid North Carolina driver's license. Successfully pass a post-job-off drug test.
