Ms. Valerie Pierce from the Public Defender's Office spoke with 30 students on 10/27 regarding their individual rights in the workplace. She emphasized the importance of education in achieving career goals.

Mr. Jim Bellamy, Outreach Counselor for Carolina Manor, spoke with students on 10/28 regarding the importance of remaining Drug Free. Mr. Bellamy emphasized issues relating to teens today: smoking and the use of illegal drugs.

Students staged a "Hands Off Drugs" campaign in the student commons area on Tuesday, Oct. 28th. Students who pledged to remain Drug Free were allowed to place their hand print on a banner. The banner is being displayed in the commons area so everyone can see our efforts to maintain a "Drug Free" school. Students were also given Red Ribbons to wear during the week.

Thursday, Oct. 30th was observed as Red Day. Students and Faculty wore Red to show their support for "Red Ribbon Week".
