PEMBROKE, N.C.-Temporarily disabled students will be rolling around campus a lot easier in the future thanks to the donation of two wheelchairs from Healthkeeperz. a Pembroke-based regional home health agency

"We need wheelchairs a lot more than you would think," said Cora Bullard, director of Student Health Services. "We really appreciate this gift. Wheelchairs are very expensive, this is a really nice thing for them to do for us

The wheelchairs will be used in a temporary basis, without charge. by injured students.

During his junior year. Maurice was on his high school's wrestling team. For two summers, he worked as a lifeguard at UNCP.

For those of us who have been knowing this young man throughout the past 18 years, the fact that he stayed in school through graduation gives us high hopes for his future. He plans to continue his education by attending Robeson Community College, where his sister, Sophia, is a student. His sister, Aundrea, also hopes to continue her education in the future.

All of us, if we remain in this world for many decades, can expect to experience tragedies or hardships of one kind or another. However, as a person who has been extremely close to this family ever since the oldest child. Aundrea. was an infant, I would like to commend Maurice and both of his sisters for their determination to overcome their personal hardships and to become contributing members of the world Organization meeting to discuss around them!
