Incumbents in the Pembroke Town election were all returned to office on Tuesday, Nov. 4. Long time Mayor Milton Hunt easily overcame a challenge by newcomer Mitch Lowry. Unofficial results show 337 for Hunt and 164 for Lowry. Incumbent town councilmen, Greg Cummings and Larry McNeill outdistanced their challengers. Cummings received 325 and Keith Jacobs received 152. Larry McNeill received 294 and Michael A. Oxendine received 155 votes. The top two vote getters are declared the winner in the race for town council.

Unofficial vote returns show Jimmy Goins as the new Tribal Chairman. Unofficial votes show he defeated Dr. Ruth Dial Woods by 86 votes. Goins received a total of 2639 and Woods received 2553. Others running for Tribal Chair were Rev. Jerry McNeill who received 795 votes; Lee Edward Sampson received 245; and Juanita Strickland received 99 votes. The election for 21 council seats showed some changes. A list of those council members by district and unofficial votes are shown below along with the race for tribal chairman. These uncertified totals were distributed by the Tribal Government office.

The cover is graced with Miss Lumbee, Morgan B. Hunt. You will need to purchase the calendar to see the other beauties.

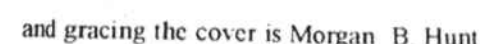
As I looked closer at the calendar, I couldn't help but notice the title of the calendar... "Native Visions of the Lumbee Women."
