NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION AND NEW REGISTRATION.

Notice is hereby given to all whom it may concern that the board of aldermen of the city of Greensboro, pursuant to the powers legally conferred upon it, has, by ordinance adopted as provided by law, called a special election to be held in accordance with the provisions regulating municipal elections in said city at the city hall in the city of Greensboro, N. C., on the fourth Tuesday of April next, it being the 20th day of April, 1910, at which election there will be submitted to the qualified registered voters of said city the question of issuing coupon bonds of said city and the levy of an annual special tax to pay said bonds at maturity and the interest thereon, as it becomes due, as follows, viz:

Thirty-five thousand (\$35,000) dollars of the city's bonds, payable thirty (30) years after their date, in denominations of one thousand (\$1,000) dollars each, bearing interest at the rate of 5 per cent. per annum, payable semi-annually; the proceeds of the sale of said bonds to be used for the purpose of erecting, equipping, altering and furnishing a school building or school buildings in the city of Greensboro, and, if necessary, of purchasing land for said building or buildings.

That for the holding of said special election J. B. Minor has been duly appointed registrar and the following named persons, judges of election:

For the First ward, J. J. Stone; For the Second ward, R. A. Gray; for the Third ward, W. L. Crawford; for the Fourth ward, John H. Rankin; for the Fifth ward, Robert Morrison; for the Sixth ward, R. A. Gilmer.

And notice is hereby further given to all whom it may concern that the said board of aldermen, pursuant to the powers conferred upon it, has duly ordered that, at and for the special election to be held as hereinbefore provided at the city hall on the 20th day of April, 1910, there be a new registration of the voters of said city and that the registration books for said election be opened for the registration of voters by the registrar for said election at the tax collector's office in the city hall on the 20th day of March, 1910, and be kept open during the hours required by law for 16 days thereafter (Sundays excepted) same to be closed ten days before said election, during which time all persons legally entitled so to do may register for said election.
