

VARYING EMOTIONS CAUSED IRREGULAR STOCK MARKET

Conditions That Depressed Grain Boyed Up Wall Street.

New York, May 9.—The stock market went through many variations of speculative temper today and showed a feeling of hesitation in the retention of any of its gains, until the firmness of the final advance.

Business in London had only got well under way before the opening hour, giving time to demonstrate the feeling of confidence there in the ability to resist the depression of the King of England's death.

Very large importance was attached to the government report on the May 1 condition of the wheat crop as a factor in the mixed opinions. Quick changes followed the actual publication of the mixed effect of the unexpected improvement in condition of winter wheat and the unexpectedly heavy increase in acreage from winter killing.

COTTON HAS A SHARP UP TURN AFTER THE HOLIDAY

Business Conditions in England Not Likely to Be Changed.

New York, May 9.—The cotton market had a very sharp advance today as a result of active covering by old crop shorts and closed firm at a gain of 5 to 10 points as compared with Friday.

The opening was steady at an advance of 1 to 7 points in response to better and covering which was apparently inspired by an idea that the showing of the Liverpool market, including large spot sales, indicated that the month of the king would be a great effect on Manchester trade conditions.
