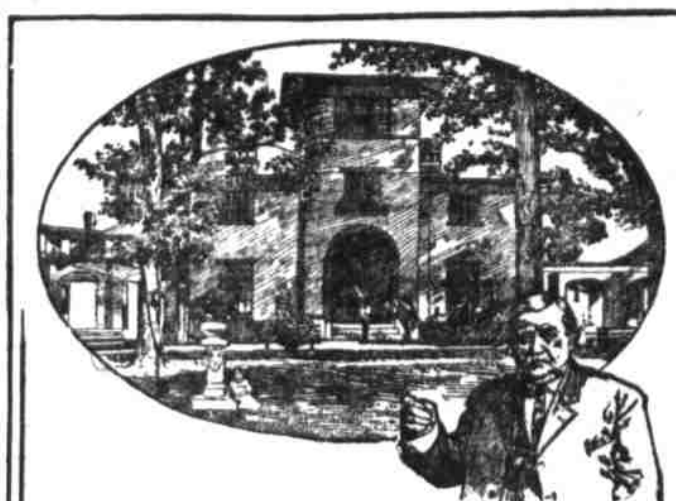
HON. SAMUEL S. MCININCH

Early in 1867 (February 3) the subject of this sketch was born in Chester, S. C. While still an infant his parents removed to Charlotte, N. C., where in early youth the blood of his Scotch Irish ancestry gave promise of a career of usefulness and activity.

His father, Franklyn A. McIninch, returning from the great Civil war, early entered heart and soul into the upbuilding of his county and state and, following the best traditions of the Whig party, to whose support North Carolina had long been true, he entered actively into politics and soon became and maintained the leadership of the Republican party in Mecklenburg county.
