Charlotte, June 16.—In a 12-inning pitchers' battle, replete with sensational plays and opportunities for a score by either side, the Hornets took the first game of the series with Anderson today, by a score of 2 to 1. Both Brazille and A. McCarthy were in fine trim and were given good support, the Hornet twirler faring better along this line than his opponent. Only four hits were made by the visitors in the first eight innings, while but three were made by the Hornets in the same number of innings. Not a run was scored until the eighth, when Hargrave's grounder was error'd by Taylor, which was followed by Garman's sacrifice and Cross' two bagger. The Electricians came back strong in the ninth and, on two infield hits and J. McCarthy's single to center, tied the score. The winning run was shoved around by the Hornets in the 12th on Garman's double, Cross' sacrifice and Coutts' bunt. Both sides threatened to score several times during the game, and it was only by great pitching and clever support that the score was as close as it was.
