WHERE IS WATERBURY?

Old Clock Raises an Interesting Question Among Waterborolites. (Special to Daily News.) Waterbury, June 16.—In the wood and iron building at the office of Captain Eaton is a clock that is a curiosity.

The clock is possibly three feet tall and about 18 inches wide and made of mahogany with hand carving. It keeps perfect time and is very old.

Captain Eaton purchased it recently and some repairs to the case being made recently the door was taken off. One of the things in the case there is pasted directions for the care of the clock with this notice: "Patent Clock invented by Eli Terry and Manufactured at Waterbury, Vt. Carolina Warranted it will used."

It is impossible to tell whether it is "North or South" Carolina as a screw hole has been made through the wood and only the letters "Vt" are legible on the reverse of the face. Two pencil scratches in the wood will give the location of the hole. One tells of the signing of the clock by a traveling trader in the year 1838 and the other of the same thing by another man in 1870. In the first instance the following endorsement is made: "on acct of Carl times, note charged \$100."

The clock was formerly the property of Mrs. Mary Lambrey now dead and was sold to her by Mr. Ballou, who in turn sold it to Captain Eaton.

Now the question is where was Waterbury in
