

HOGAN SURRENDERED THE RAYLE HEARING FATE WITH THE JURY

Had Been Dodging Officers a Year. Many Witnesses and All of Summer Noted Williams Postoffice Conspiracy Will Be on Hand. Case Concluded at 4.45.

Sapp Hogan, the most wanted negro in Greensboro, voluntarily surrendered to Officers Jeffries and Mackintosh yesterday afternoon and in a few minutes he was sitting at the bar of the court...

Deputies Weatherly and Crutcher had returned from a scouting expedition in Sumner township, where the brutal murder of Miss Lydia Newman occurred last July. Incidentally the officers summoned a number of witnesses to appear here tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock...

The conspiracy case, in which the United States alleges that N. Glenn Williams and Thomas and Eliza Craft conspired to defraud the postoffice department through the office at Williams in Yadkin county, was given to the jury at 4.45 yesterday afternoon...

A stated Hogan has been wanted for the past year for a variety of reasons. He is a fugitive from justice and has been dodging officers for a long time...

The officers state that considerable interest is manifested by citizens of the entire township in the outcome of the trial, and from appearances the entire population of the township will be here Saturday. Besides the witnesses summoned from Sumner several will be brought here from other towns...

Considerable interest attaches to the case, especially in the relations of N. Glenn Williams with the Crafts and the postoffice at the town which bears his name. Mr. Williams has a number of close relations in Greensboro and throughout the town...
