AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 305 OF THE CITY ORDINANCES. Be it ordained by the city council of Greensboro: That section 305 of the printed ordinances of Greensboro be amended so as to read as follows: Section 305. Charges for Cleaning. That every owner of land in the city of Greensboro upon which land there is a surface closet shall annually pay to the tax collector the sum of \$4.00 for each such closet, for having the same cleaned as provided by section 302, and the same must be paid during the month of January. The tax collector shall issue a metal license tag which must be attached to the closet for which the tax is paid, in a position such that it will be in plain view. Licenses shall run from January 1 to December 31. For the charge aforesaid the city shall cause such closet to be cleaned as by these ordinances provided, without further expense to the owner. Provided, a charge of 50 cents a trip shall be made for cleaning closets in public places.

Section 306 be amended by striking out the figures 305 (referring to section number) where the same appear therein and substituting in lieu thereof the figures 305, so that same shall refer to the section above set out. That this ordinance go into effect upon its passage. The foregoing ordinance was adopted by the council December 22, 1921. W. L. MURRAY, City Clerk.
