MISS MARIE KINNARD BURIED IN COLUMBIA

Former Member Of Greensboro High School Faculty And Well Known In The City.

Miss Marie Kinnard, former teacher in the Greensboro high school and well known in the city, who died in Winston-Salem, November 23, in her 23rd year, was buried at Columbia, S. C., December 1. The funeral services being attended by a large number of friends and relatives.

Miss Kinnard was born in Columbia while her father, Dr. M. M. Kinnard, was pastor of Ebenezer church. She spent her school years in Knoxville and Salisbury and her four years of college life in North Carolina. She graduated from the high school of Salisbury in 1916 and from college in 1920.

For one year she taught in the Greensboro high school and one year in Winston-Salem. She resigned her position during the present year that she might take a special course in the George Peabody Teachers' college at Nashville, Tenn. Miss Kinnard had enrolled in the college for her M. A. degree in psychology and English, when her physical condition made it necessary for her to defer her entrance until the opening term in 1923. In the meantime the necessity arose for an operation for appendicitis, from which she never recovered.




