

WANT MORE FUNDS FOR HOME ECONOMICS WORK

Miss Moran Reports Increase in Number of Girls Taking Course This Year

HELP TO HOUSEKEEPERS

Staleigh, Dec. 20.—With a record of having 72 schools in the state teaching home economics this year, an increase of 17 over 1921, and having turned down approximately \$1 applications for the course, the state home economics department will endeavor to secure an increased appropriation to broaden its operations in 1923, according to an announcement today by Miss Katherine Moran, assistant director.

For the present year, the department had an appropriation of \$26,143.39, from state and federal funds. Next year, it was stated, at least \$44,000 will be requested. There are 62 white schools in the state with home economics courses at present in comparison with 1921. This year, there are 10 negro schools with the course, as compared with six the previous year.

much for the betterment of home economics is the material improvement that has been made in the equipment of the various schools. Next year, we are planning further improvements in this direction. The division of vocational education has issued a list of equipment required in all state-paid schools. This list includes a minimum and a standard requirement. Many schools have measured up to this. A prescribed reference library to be kept in the home economics department is a part of the requirement.

In addition to their class room work, many of the teachers have conducted evening classes in home economics for the women of various communities. There were approximately 500 women enrolled in these classes during the year. It is planned to increase these classes.

"Two-thirds of our teachers are of the A grade rating, and we want to better this average. In asking for a larger appropriation we have in view the acceptance of more schools for the home economics work. We believe that the demand for the course during the year will show the importance of an increase in funds," she said.

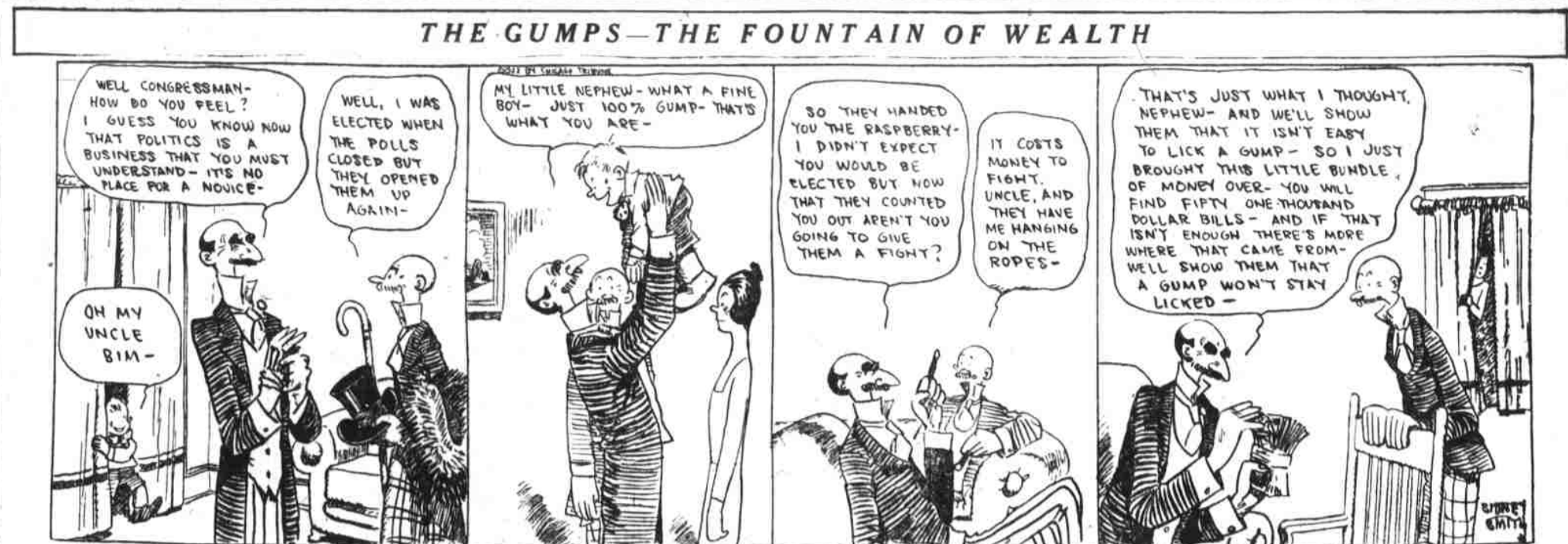
Miss Moran stated a large number of conferences had been held during recent months in relation to the work of her department and all of the schools were co-operating for the extension of the department's program.
