

Y. M. C. A. QUINT BOWS TO THE QUAKER FIVE

Guilford College Varsity Basketball Usher in Season With a 35 to 32 Win.

The local Y. M. C. A. is represented in the field of basketball by an exceptionally good bunch of cage toilers. The Guilford college quint is also well versed in the indoor court game. It was last night that these two teams met in action against each other and in that combat the Quakers invaded the lair of the locals and whipped them on their own court by piling up 35 points while the Y. M. C. A. basketweavers contented themselves with but 32 points. The game served as the marker of two events—the first defeat of the season for the local quint and the opening of the season with a victory for the collegians, instructed in athletics by Bob Deak.

The Guilford college quint took the ball through the hoop for a half dozen two pointers and shot 15 foul goals in 20 attempts. It was his ability to score from a 15-foot mark that proved the downfall of the local team, coached by C. Wistar Stockard. None of the guards in the game figured in the scoring but all played exceptionally well. With defeat staring them in the face the local club attempted many long shots at the basket only to find them missing the hoop while the ball fell into the hands of one of the Deak players.


