## LOCAL ENGINEER WINS IN SHARP BIDDING

## THIS YEAR'S SEASON SHORTEST IN YEARS

In competition with eighteen engineers from all parts of the nation, Mr. Norman L. Royal of this city, a consulting engineer, was the successful bidder for the erection of the new reservoir for the city of Durham. The award was made this week by the Durham Aldermen and the plans call for the erection of a forty million gallon reservoir for the city, the consulting engineer, Mr. Gilbert C. White having some weeks ago asked for bid. There was a wide range of bidding from the engineers and the amount ranged from \$100,000 up to \$60,000 for the improvements. Following the opening of the bids there were two or three thrown out on account of reasons best known to the aldermen and the award was made to Mr. Norman Royal of this city who will be started within the next ten days.
