

BREAKS ALL RECORDS

Are Disappointed over a
Failure to Bring Down
Their Tenth Aeroplane
Together in the European
War.

Paris, Oct. 10.—Lieutenant Duulin, a French aviator, has broken the record for the number of aeroplanes brought down in a single flight. On Aug. 21, he brought down his tenth aeroplane, which gives him a total of twenty-four.

Duulin, who is only 26 years old, joined the French aviation service on May 25, 1915, his license being No. 268, which gives some idea of the number of aviators France has already disposed of.

De La Tour, who came from an old noble French family, and his two young sons, were the first to bring down an aeroplane. They were followed by a couple of months. Now, the two young aviators have joined forces, and their success has been instantaneous. They insist on flying together, and they are now the most successful aviators in France.

WAR LOAN INDICATES FAITH IN ALLIES

Tokio, Oct. 10.—The fact that a loan to Russia of 70 million yen (about \$2,000,000) was twice oversubscribed by the public has attracted considerable attention in Japan and is regarded by the press as indicating faith in the victory of the Entente allies and faith in the power of the rehabilitation of Russia. The loan was at six per cent and consisted of Russian treasury bonds.

It is likely that additional loans of a similar nature will be made subsequently as Russia desires to raise a total of 250 million yen in Japan (about 125 million dollars). It is understood that the loan will be utilized in the payment of munitions of war purchased by Russia.

TO GIVE ARTIFICIAL
LIMBS TO THE
INJURED

TOKIO, Oct. 10.—Lieutenant Sadao has decided to supply artificial limbs and eyes to the Japanese and Germans who were wounded in the campaign at King's how.

The estate belonging to the Imperial Household is estimated to reach about 500,000,000 yen or \$20,000,000. Besides railway and bank securities and various public bonds and debentures held by the household, which are valued at approximately 180,000,000 yen, there are the imperial buildings, including extensive forests and rice lands, in addition to the land of the Imperial palace grounds and the Imperial御所 palaces and villas. The value of the Imperial property is reported to be increasing at the rate of twenty per cent per annum.

TITLE "JEFÉ DE LAS ARMAS"
ORDERED ABOLISHED IN MEXICO

Mexico City, Oct. 10.—An order has been issued by General Alvaro Obregon, Minister of War, abolishing the title and position of "Jefe de las Armas," throughout the republic. This is taken to mean one of the initial steps in the diminishing of military control throughout Mexico. According to the powers, the jefes de las armas or military commanders supersede those of the civil authorities and judges, according to Obregon's decree. But commanders of garrisons will have authority over their own men only and will not deal in any way with the civil administration. Those who have been acting as administrators without

military command have been ordered to rejoin their regiments or brigades at once.

GERMANY ELECTRICAL
INTERESTS FLOURISH

New York, Oct. 10.—The German electrical industry is scoring a triumph in the midst of the distractions of the war by building the largest generator and transformer in the world, according to advice received here. The Siemens-Schuckertwerke of Berlin are building a generator and transformer each sixty thousand K. W., the transformer having the power to transform the voltage to 110,000 volts. The order is being executed for the Rhineish-Westphalian Elec-

trical Works. It is said the largest turbo-generators in the United States are 35,000 or 40,000 K. W.


