FOOTBALL SEASON TURNING POINT

Acid Test Is To Be Applied in Games Tomorrow and Fittest Will be Chosen

New York, Oct. 27.—Yale, Harvard and Princeton, the "big three" of the eastern football tangle, will go into the crucial points of their 1916 careers tomorrow. Yale is due to show its strength to the strong Washington and Jefferson teams; Harvard must tackle Cornell, and Princeton will be willing to call it a real day's work if the Tigers are able to take a fall out of Dartmouth.

Inter-sectional battles of more or less importance are found on the day's calendar, with Indiana meeting Tufts, that surprising bunch of veteran eastern warriors, in Indianapolis. It will be the second big meeting between eastern and western eleven, Colgate having already lowered the colors of the Illinois huskies. Illinois is considered stronger than Tufts, so Tufts should have little trouble in downing Indiana.

The Oregon Aggie and Michigan Aggie will be at it in East Lansing at the same time Michigan is playing her big battles of the year, the contest with Syracuse.

NEW METHOD OF GIVING AN ALARM

Illicit Distillers Make Trouble for Officers by Exploding Dynamite

Hickory, N. C., Oct. 27.—Dynamite placed on a mountain peak and exploded to give warning of the approach of revenue officers is the unique method of spreading the alarm among the illicit whiskey distillers in Burke county, according to Deputy Collector P. P. Jones, who makes his headquarters here. The "moonshiners" have ample time to reach places of safety, Mr. Jones said, and it is only with great difficulty that revenue agents locate the stills and their operations.

for illicit stills and those attached to the Hickory headquarters are kept busy searching the hills and valleys in their territory, the several counties west of here. The last big outfit located in this Catawba county this week was operated with a steam engine and equipped with a still that held 257 gallons of "shine" or mash, with a capacity of 30 gallons of liquor per day. The waste water was conducted underground to a nearby swampy place where it was allowed to seep into the swamp and earth.
